Middle son Carlo is set to graduate from South Georgia Technical College, where he is training to become a licensed A&P mechanic specializing in aircraft maintenance. Meanwhile, youngest son Dominic maintains an impressive 4.0 GPA at Roswell High School and dreams of studying architecture or engineering at either Georgia Tech or UGA. Their commitment to education is a source of pride for Michael and Marineli, who strive to instill the value of hard work and community service in their sons.

Traveling is another cherished aspect of the Dal Cerro family's life. They frequently journey to Italy to connect with family and explore their heritage.
